# WHAT IS THIS PRODUCT?

#### TYPE

The product is issued as uncertificated security under Swiss Law. Apart from the form and establishment of the product, all rights and obligations arising from it shall be determined in all respects in accordance with English law. It has no capital protection against market risk.

TERM

The product does not have a fixed term. It may be exercised by the investor or terminated by the Issuer.

OBJECTIVES

Objective of the product is to provide you with a specified entitlement according to predefined conditions.

You may exercise the product upon delivery of a prior written notice on predefined dates (Exercise Date) considering the Exercise Notice Period, with effect on the relevant Valuation Date.

Furthermore, the Issuer has the right to early terminate the product on a date designated at its discretion (the Ordinary Termination Date) subject to prior notification with effect on the relevant Valuation Date. After exercise or termination, you will receive a Redemption Amount in the Currency of the Product on the relevant Redemption Date. The relevant Valuation Date is the Exercise Date or the Ordinary Termination Date.

The Redemption Amount will be calculated on each trading day. The Redemption Amount on the relevant Valuation Date is the product of the Reference Price and the ratio between the Redemption Amount on the immediately preceding trading day and the Reference Price on the immediately preceding trading day taking into account the Performance of the Exchange Rate. The Management Fee is deducted from the result of this calculation. The Performance of the Exchange Rate equals the Exchange Rate on the relevant Valuation Date divided by the Exchange Rate on the immediately preceding trading day.

You are not entitled to any right or entitlement resulting from the components of the Underlying (e.g. dividends, voting rights).



# WHAT ARE THE RISKS AND WHAT COULD I GET IN RETURN?

We have classified this product as 6 out of 7, which is the second-highest risk class.

# WHAT HAPPENS IF BNP PARIBAS S.A. IS UNABLE TO PAY OUT?

Should the Issuer default or file for bankruptcy, you have the right to seek payment from the Guarantor pursuant to an unconditional and irrevocable guarantee of any amount due. # WHAT ARE THE COSTS?

### COSTS OVER TIME

The tables show the amounts that are taken from your investment to cover different types of costs. # HOW LONG SHOULD I HOLD IT AND CAN I TAKE MONEY OUT EARLY?

#### Recommended holding period: 5 years

The average investor holds this kind of product for about 5 years on average. Furthermore, we have chosen this period to enhance comparability with other investment products without a fixed lifetime.

In addition to selling the product through the exchange where the product is listed or off-exchange you may ask the Issuer for early redemption of the product by exercising your Warrant Right upon delivery of a prior written notice on predefined days. Please note that you may be required to hold a minimum number of products greater than one for effective exercise. You must instruct your depository bank, which is responsible for the order of the transfer of the specified products. Upon effective exercise you will receive a Redemption Amount as described in more detail under "What is this product?" above.

Under normal market conditions, you may sell this product in the secondary market. The price depends on the markets parameters prevailing at the time, which could put the invested amount at risk.

Please be aware that exchange trading of the product may cease prior to the Valuation Date.

In unusual market situations, or in the event of technical faults/disruptions, a purchase and/or sale of the product can be temporarily hindered, or may not be possible at all.
