You are about to purchase a product that is not simple and may be difficult to understand.

► TYPE

This product is a certificate, a transferable debt instrument. It has a full capital protection against market risk at maturity.

► TERM

This product has a fixed term and will redeem on the Redemption Date.

► OBJECTIVES

The objective of this product is to provide you with a return based on the performance of an underlying index.

On the Redemption Date you will receive in respect of each certificate:

1. If the Final Reference Price is greater than or equal to 140% of the Initial Reference Price: a payment in cash equal to 140% of the Notional Amount.

2. If the Final Reference Price is less than 140% of the Initial Reference Price:

a) if the Reference Price on any of the Lock-In Valuation Dates is greater than or equal to one of the Lock-In Barriers, a payment in cash corresponding to the maximum between

- i. the highest Lock-In Level reached on the Lock-In Valuation Dates and
- ii. the Notional Amount, increased by the Performance of the Underlying

b) if the Reference Price on each of the Lock-In Valuation Dates has always been below 105% (the lowest Lock-In level),

- i. if the Final Reference Price is greater than or equal to 100% of the Initial Reference Price a payment in cash equal to the Notional Amount, increased by the Performance of the Underlying.
- ii. if the Final Reference Price is less than 100% of the Initial Reference Price, a payment in cash equal to the Notional Amount.

Where:

- A Lock-In Event occurs if, on a Lock-In Valuation Date, the closing price of the Underlying is greater than or equal to a Lock-In Barrier
- The Performance of an Underlying is the difference between its Final Reference Price and its Initial Reference Price, divided by its Initial Reference Price, expressed in absolute value.
- The Initial Reference Price is the closing price of the Underlying on the Strike Date.
- The Final Reference Price is the closing price of the Underlying on the Redemption Valuation Date.

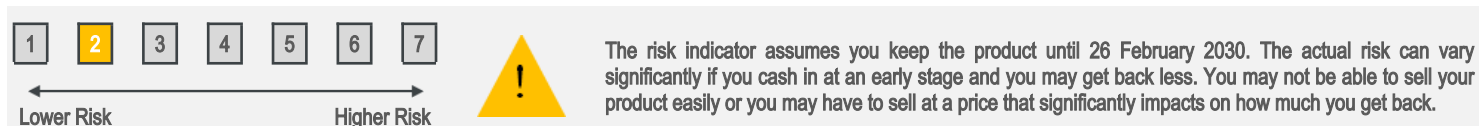
▶ INTENDED RETAIL INVESTOR

This product has been designed for retail investors who:

- have a medium term investment horizon (three to five years).
- seek to invest in a capital growth product, potentially to diversify their portfolio.
- seek protection of the Notional Amount at maturity.
- have been informed or have sufficient knowledge of the financial markets, their functioning and their risks, and the asset class of the underlying.
- have one or more of the following characteristics:
 - average knowledge of relevant financial products (an informed investor can make an informed investment decision based on the product's legal documentation, as well as knowledge and understanding of the specific factors/risks highlighted within it).
 - Investment experience.

WHAT ARE THE RISKS AND WHAT COULD I GET IN RETURN?

▶ RISK INDICATOR



The summary risk indicator (SRI) is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will lose money because of movements in the markets or because we are not able to pay you.

We have classified this product as 2 out of 7, which is a low risk class.

This rates the potential losses from future performance at a low level, and poor market conditions are very unlikely to impact our capacity to pay you.

You will receive payments in the product's currency, which may be different from your domestic currency. In this case, **be aware of currency risk**. The final return you will get depends on the exchange rate between the two currencies. This risk is not considered in the indicator shown above.

You are entitled to receive back at least 100% of your capital (capital means Notional Amount). Any amount over this, and any additional return, depends on future market performance and is uncertain. However, this protection against future market performance will not apply if you cash-in before maturity.

If we are not able to pay you what is owed, you could lose your entire investment.

► COSTS OVER TIME

HOW LONG SHOULD I HOLD IT AND CAN I TAKE MY MONEY OUT EARLY?

Recommended holding period: until 26 February 2030, which corresponds to the product's maturity.

The objective of the product is to provide you with the redemption profile described under "What is this product?" above. This only applies if the product is held until maturity.

Under normal market conditions, you may sell this product in the secondary market, at a price depending on the market's parameters prevailing at the time, which could put the invested amount at risk. Should you decide to resell, a fee of 0.50% will be deducted from the market price which could be increased under specific market condition.

The 0.50% commission has been taken into account in the table. In addition, the distributor may charge additional costs in the event of an exit before the maturity.
